Project Summary

ATM assisted the City of Hardeeville with several infrastructure and recreation-oriented tasks as part of the Hardeeville Community Campus project. Phase I of the Hardeeville Community Campus project led to Hardeeville receiving the 2006 South Carolina Municipal Achievement Award.

ATM, in conjunction with a team of architects, landscape architects, and contractors, designed, permitted, and constructed a 40-acre multi-use municipal complex and recreation facilities. The complex included a new city hall building, football and soccer fields, and a regulation baseball/softball diamond complex. The city hall was constructed in the same location as the former Old Hardeeville Consolidated School complex. The school had fallen into disrepair, and after asbestos and lead-based paint abatement the facility was demolished in 2003. To honor the former historical landmark, the new city hall was built with its façade identical to the old school house.



In addition to the municipal and recreational facilities, an oversized recreational lake has become a regional stormwater management system to relieve areas of the City not meeting the Level of Service Standards set by the City's Stormwater Regulations. A system of pump stations and intermediary stormwater management ponds are planned, with one Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) pump station project currently underway that will ultimately discharge to the municipal complex lake for flood attenuation.
