Project Summary

ATM worked with the City of Atlantic Beach, Florida, to prepare the 2006 Sewer Master Plan Update and 10-Year Capital Improvement Plan. The update included evaluations and recommendations for the following components of the City's sewer system: Gravity Collection System, Pump Stations, Forcemains, and Wastewater Treatment Plants (WWTPs).



Engineers from the ATM Project Team met with City staff to review historical documents and conduct field evaluations of various sewer system components. To facilitate the necessary rehabilitation of the City's infrastructure while maintaining the City's "pay as you go" budget, ATM presented a prioritized and systematic 10-year approach to repairing the sewer system.

As part of the WWTP evaluation, the ATM Project Team evaluated options for the City to meet the anticipated Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) legislation. The evaluation involved developing a BioWin model of the City's main treatment plant to review potential nutrient reduction under various scenarios. The recommended option for the City involves conversion of their 3.0 million gallon per day (mgd) WWTP to a 4-Stage Bardenpho process, minor process upgrades to their Sequencing Batch Reactor WWTP, and implementing a reuse program.

ATM presented the 90% findings to the City's budgeting committee to facilitate development of the 2007 spending budget. Once complete, ATM presented a summary of the project and findings at a City Commission meeting.
